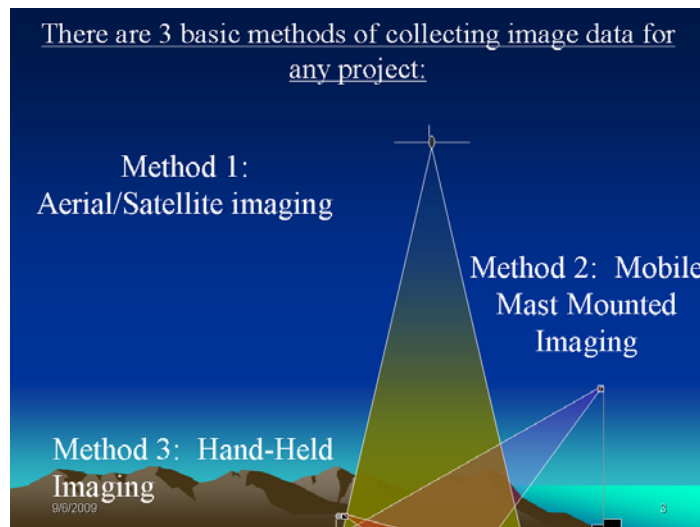

Besides being more encompassing and comprehensive than a picture taken at the ground level, elevated pictures answer questions not always

obvious with ground shots.

Another advantage of elevated photography is that it is more cost effective than the other services. True, these services provide images that are larger in scale and give geographic relevance compared to elevated shots, but neither do they provide the detail or synoptic relevance on as timely a basis. Aerial/satellite imaging, typically, does not give the detail you see in the above photo – letters on signs and roadway markings clearly visible in an overhead view. Elevated images are also compatible with available GIS (geographic information systems) software.

Perhaps, it is important for you to collect data and images that reflect or tell the story of how a particular facility was built, or what happened. Beltair Industries, Inc, located in the San Diego area, intends to provide a highly niched service to those who can make use of it.
